
Puzzle # 95 – April 2009 "Marketplace"

Instructions: Guess the words defined by the cryptic clues (words vary in length from three to seven letters, and three are capitalized) then enter them in the grid one after another in the same order as their clues, starting in the upper left corner. Across words that don't end at the right continue on the next row, and down words that don't end at the bottom continue in the next column. Four across words and four down words won't fit in the grid unless they exchange a letter with each other. Each exchange is between an across and a down word, and each results in two new, unclued words one of which is capitalized. The exchanged letters, taken in order, spell an appropriate eight-letter word. Thanks to Kevin Wald for test-solving and editing this puzzle.
